MAIN TOPICS ADDRESSED

- Need for specialized training on mental health issues for Juvenile Justice and Child Protection front line practitioners
- Importance of reflecting on the ethics involved in a multiagency and interdisciplinary intervention with minors and youth with mental health and drug abuse issues
- How to improve the interagency coordination instruments amongst the Mental Health, Child Protection and Juvenile Justice departments
- Issues arising from the Pilot project implemented by the Therapeutic Unit

SPECIALISED TRAINING ON MENTAL HEALTH

- Need for Juvenile Justice and Child Protection front line practitioners to count on better knowledge on mental health basics in order to:
 - Have an improved tool kit when addressing youth who present behavioural issues
 - Identify whether the young person has an actual mental health condition which requires referral to a specialized service

 - Previous positive experience with training on drug abuse for Child Protection and Juvenile Justice practitioners
 - “A primera línia” organised by the Deputy Direction on Drugs

- Importance of including practitioners of different fields in the same training
- Need to devise a long term strategy for a more “systematic” training scheme

SHARED UNDERSTANDING ON THE ETHICS INVOLVED IN THE INTERVENTION WITH MINORS WITH MENTAL HEALTH AND DRUG ABUSE ISSUES

- Need to allow shared room for professionals from different services to reflect on their respective approaches about the ethic principles informing decision making in the multi-agency and interdisciplinary work and develop a common language

- Workshop on the 15th and 22nd of February 2018 “Ethics in the implementation of a comprehensive service for minor offenders with a mental health condition”
 - Organised Parc Sanitari Sant Joan de Déu in collaboration with the Justice Department
 - Dissemination event of the project Fact for Minors

Ètica de la intervenció integral amb menors infractors amb trastorns de salut mental

Presentació

El present taller s'ha organitzat en el marc del Projecte FACT FOR MINORS *Promovent l'atenció alternativa per menors amb problemàtica de salut mental i addiccions- JUST/2015/RCHI/AG/PROF*, cofinançat per la Comissió Europea i que té com a objectiu principal reforçar la capacitat dels professionals i potenciar enfocaments de treball multidisciplinari per donar millor resposta a les necessitats dels menors amb dificultats de càrrec psicològic, psiquiàtric, desordres de personalitat i/o addiccions, que hagin estat objecte d'una mesura judicial per la comissió d'un delicte.

El projecte preveu la realització d'activitats diverses d'estudi i posada en comú dels diferents models organitzatius d'intervenció terapèutica i educativa pels menors amb problemes de salut mental i/o addicions, existents als 5 països que hi participen (Itàlia, Finlàndia, Portugal, Alemanya i Catalunya), per tal d'identificar les bones pràctiques que poden ser extrapolables. Concretament a Catalunya, la Unitat Terapèutica del Centre Educatiu Els Til·lers-Parc Sanitari Sant Joan de Déu (PSSJD), amb el suport del Departament de Justícia, porta a terme aquests objectius. En aquest projecte també s'hi han incorporat les administracions públiques competents en matèria de justícia juvenil constituint-se un Comitè Assessor Nacional (CAN) a cada país. El CAN integra representants de totes les organitzacions, judicials, sanitàries i de protecció, que intervenen en relació als menors d'edat amb

problemàtica de salut mental que han de complir una mesura judicial d'internament terapèutic.

La tasca del CAN consisteix en donar suport i fer el seguiment de les experiències i activitats que s'implementin a Catalunya en el decurs del projecte amb l'objectiu d'arribar a un acord formal o a l'elaboració de recomanacions orientades a millorar els mecanismes de coordinació entre els organismes i serveis que intervenen en l'atenció d'aquesta població.

En el decurs de les reunions dutes a terme pel CAN, entre d'altres aspectes, es va identificar la necessitat de disposar d'espais de reflexió sobre els criteris ètics que entren en joc en el treball interdisciplinari amb joves i menors amb trastorns de salut mental i/o addicions. El taller que us presentem neix per donar resposta a aquesta inquietud.

Destinataris

Educadors socials, Treballadors socials, Psiquiatres, Psicòlegs, Coordinadors de l'àmbit de la justícia juvenil, salut i protecció de menors, així com altres professionals que treballin en l'àmbit de l'atenció a menors amb trastorns de salut mental i/o addicions que han de complir una mesura judicial d'internament terapèutic.

Objectius

Millorar la perspectiva ètica aplicada a la relació assistencial amb menors amb patologia mental i problemàtica legal.

Disposar d'eines de valoració i anàlisi en casos que presenten conflictes ètics.

IMPROVING INTERAGENCY COORDINATION INSTRUMENTS

Existing coordination instruments at the start of the project:

- 2005 Collaboration agreement between Justice and Health Departments to implement a mental health and substance abuse support programme for juvenile justice

- 2013 Collaboration agreement between the Justice and Social Welfare Departments on the protection of children and youth

2005 COLLABORATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN JUSTICE AND HEALTH DEPARTMENTS TO IMPLEMENT A MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SUPPORT PROGRAMME FOR JUVENILE JUSTICE

- Health Department provides mental health and substance abuse attention to juvenile justice young persons through the public mental health services
 - Creation of the Therapeutic Unit Els Til·lers.

- Both departments will implement programmes to foster health and prevention addressed to young persons undergoing a Juvenile Justice criminal process and their families

- Foresees other measures:
 - Specific advise to juvenile justice staff
 - Drafting of coordination protocols
 - Continued training on juvenile justice for health professionals who work in juvenile justice

- Requires revision and update of objectives and specific measures

2013 COLLABORATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN JUSTICE AND FAMILY AND SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENTS ON CHILDREN AND YOUTH PROTECTION

Objectives:

- Strengthening collaborative relations to develop training and research on topics of common interest
 - Improving collaborative relations between professionals of both Departments when is required by the judicial measure or the minor's personal situation
 - Minors on Child Protection who have to serve a judicial measure
 - Minors under 14 on Child Protection who have committed criminal behaviour
 - Minors who are victims or witnesses which require the involvement of Victim Support, Child Protection, Technical Advisory Service for Minors (SMAT) and Forensic Psychology Advisory Team
- Room for improvement in the current degree of implementation:
- Foresee more specific actions to accomplish goals
 - Define carefully who will be responsible for what

2017-2019 INTEGRATED INTERDEPARTMENTAL PLAN ON THE ATTENTION TO INDIVIDUALS WITH MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE ISSUES

- Signed in March 2017
- Departments involved: Health, Education, Labour, Social Welfare and Justice including the Government Secretary
- Public policy planning tool which gives coherence and consistency to the developments implemented by the different departments and non-statutory agencies
- Includes 11 Strategic Lines with subsequent objectives and specific actions
- Puts in place specific instruments to accomplish goals such as evaluation and follow-up schemes.
- Working groups for the implementation of objectives and actions

2017-2019 INTEGRATED INTERDEPARTMENTAL PLAN ON THE ATTENTION TO INDIVIDUALS WITH MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE ISSUES

- **Strategic line 2. Fostering the integration of the interventions of health, social and education services for children and youth who experience vulnerability and their families**

- Objective 2.2. Implement a new model of mental health support service for children and young persons who are under Child Protection
 - Improving the specialized attention on mental health to Child Protection residential centers
 - Implementing a common training program for professionals of Child Protection and Mental Health services

2017-2019 INTEGRATED INTERDEPARTMENTAL PLAN ON THE ATTENTION TO INDIVIDUALS WITH MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE ISSUES

- **Strategic line 7. Improving mental health services for individuals serving judicial measures such as probation, prison and juvenile justice measures**
 - Objective 7.2. boosting mental health resources available to custodial centres for juveniles
 - Signature of a collaboration agreement between the HD and the JJD in order to improve the mental health services provided to minors serving a judicial measure
 - Increase of the available places at the Therapeutic Unit Els Til.lers
- July 2017, Coordination agreement between Justice and Health Departments for implementing a mental health and substance abuse support programme in the framework of the criminal sanctions services in Catalonia

2017 Coordination agreement between Justice and Health Departments for implementing a mental health and substance abuse support programme in the framework of the criminal sanctions services in Catalonia

□ Scope:

- adults serving prison sentence or probation
- minors on an educative centre or community measure

□ Objectives:

- Ensuring equal access to comprehensive mental health and substance abuse services to adults and minors involved in the criminal justice system including:
 - Ambulatory care services in the community
 - Prevention, specialised assistance and rehabilitation
- Interagency and multidisciplinary intervention by criminal justice and health practitioners should be comprehensive and integrated (not only coordinated)
 - Ensuring a continuum in the quality of mental health or drug abuse treatment in the transition from the custodial or prison setting, to the “release” into their community of care
 - “Integration” goes beyond simply “coordination” of interventions

2017 Coordination agreement between Justice and Health Departments for implementing a mental health and substance abuse support programme in the framework of the criminal sanctions enforcement services in Catalonia

- Services will be devised by Health Department in collaboration with Justice Department in those aspects where coordination and complementarity between health and penal execution teams is needed in order to meet the specificities of the different settings
 - prisons, conditional release and semi-open regime, juvenile justice educative centres, adults on probation and minors on educative measures

- For minors serving a custodial judicial measure, mental health and drug abuse assistance can be provided in the form of:
 - Ambulatory health care services
 - Placement in the Therapeutic Unit or

- For minors serving a community measure who require compulsory mental health treatment, assistance will be provided by the regular public mental health and drug abuse services existing in the community

2017 Coordination agreement between Justice and Health Departments for implementing a mental health and substance abuse support programme in the framework of the criminal sanctions enforcement services in Catalonia

- Specialised advice will be provided to juvenile justice practitioners
- Mental health and drug abuse services should be made available in every educative centre for minors
 - Only if suffering a severe condition should the minor be moved to an external unit
- Justice and Health Departments will implement programmes for the improvement and prevention of mental health issues in prisons and juvenile justice centres

2017 Coordination agreement between Justice and Health Departments for implementing a mental health and substance abuse support programme in the framework of the criminal sanctions enforcement services in Catalonia

□ Means foreseen in order to reach goals:

- HD will enable the access to resources necessary for the implementation of services
- JD will foster the access to these resources
- HD will undertake specific actions (circulars and statutes) to ensure that health services are informed of the new collaboration agreements reached within the integrated approach
- Collaboration between HD and JD in implementing continued training of health and penal execution professionals
- JD will inform practitioners about the range of services available to their centre
- Collaboration protocols will be drafted and evaluated by a Commission responsible for the agreement follow-up

→ Robust collaboration instrument as specific actions, evaluation and follow-up measures have been foreseen

NEXT STEPS OF THE NAB IN CATALONIA

- Providing support to the implementation of the pilot project carried out by the Therapeutic Unit Els Til·lers
 - Liaise with Juvenile Justice
 - Informative meeting with juvenile justice practitioners involved in cases dealt with by the pilot project (23rd January 2018)

- Drafting recommendations to improve interagency coordination and interdisciplinary work drawing on:
 - NAB discussions held in meetings
 - Results of the Pilot project carried out by TU

- Lobbying for the review and upgrade of the 2013 Collaboration agreement between Justice and Social Welfare Departments on children and youth protection

- Organise dissemination events
